## RESOLUTION ON THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF ANGOLA

The Council of Ministers of the Organization of African Unity, meeting in its Fifty-second Ordinary Session in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, from 3 to 8 July 1990,

<u>Having considered</u> the report of the OAU Secretary-General on the situation in Southern Africa.

<u>Having heard</u> the statement on the Peace and National Reconciliation Process in Angola, made by the Head of the Angola Delegation,

<u>Guided by</u> the principle of the OAU Charter and the common determination of all the Member States to contribute to the promotion of peace, freedom and socio-economic progress of the continent:

- COMMENDS the Government of the People's Republic of Angola for its peace efforts and EXPRESSES SATISFACTION as new developments in the peace process with the establishment of direct contacts between the Government of Angola and UNITA;
- 2. VEHEMENTLY CONDEMNS the continued interference in the internal affairs of the People's Republic of Angola, particularly the supply of military equipment and other facilities by the United States of America and South Africa;
- 3. CALLS ON the international community to bring pressure to bear on the Administration of North America and the Government of South Africa to cease all support to UNITA, so as to facilitate the on-going direct contacts aimed at creating the conditions conducive to the establishment of lasting peace in Angola;
- 4. APPEALS to all African States and particularly the neighboring states of Angola to assist in promoting the conditions conducive to lasting peace in Angola.
