## RESOLUTION ON THE BAMAKO CONVENTION ON THE BAN ON THE IMPORT OF HAZARDOUS WASTES INTO AFRICA AND ON THE CONTROL OF THEIR TRANS-BOUNDARY MOVEMENTS WITHIN AFRICA

The Council of Ministers of the Organization of African Unity, meeting in its Fifty-fourth Ordinary Session in Abuja, Federal Republic of Nigeria, from 27 May to 1 June 1991,

<u>Having considered</u> the report of the Secretary-General of the OAU (Doc. CM/1673 (LIV)) on the Pan-African Conference on Environment and Sustainable Development held in Bamako, Mali, from 23 to 30 January 1991,

<u>Recalling</u> Resolutions 1153 (XLVIII) on the Dumping of Nuclear and Industrial Wastes in Africa and CM/Res.1199 (XLIX) on the Basel Convention on the Control of Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes,

<u>Recalling further</u> Resolution CM/Res.1225 (L) on setting-up of a Working Group composed of Legal and Technical Environment Experts to draw up an African Convention on the Control of all Forms of Hazardous Wastes in the Continent,

<u>Mindful</u> that the objectives of the Bamako Convention are to adequately address Africa's interests and concerns in response to the loopholes contained in the Basel Convention:

- 1. TAKES NOTE with satisfaction of the Secretary-General's report on this issue;
- 2. EXPRESSES ITS APPRECIATION to ECA, UNEP, Greenpeace International and the Asian-African Legal Consultation Committee For their cooperation;
- 3. REQUESTS OAU Member States who have not yet signed and ratify the Convention to do so, so as to bring it into force;
- 4. REQUESTS the Secretary-General to ensure the widest publicity on the Convention;
- 5. ENCOURAGES Member States to organize national and sub-regional seminars with a view to disseminating information on the Convention.
