The Pan-African Parliament resolves that:

- The PAP establishes a Standing Committee on APRM to be drawn from member states.
- In the meantime, PAP should refer APRM reports of member states to the Committee on Justice and Human Rights until such time that a permanent Standing Committee on APRM is established.
- PAP should utilize the APRM to strategically enhance its relevance & unique role of and become a central part of the peer review system, promoting oversight & accountability.
- The PAP is uniquely placed to elevate the APRM as a core agenda item, and monitor and evaluate progress on a cross-country basis
