Notice is hereby given that His Excellency the President in accordance with regulation 30G of the Emergency Powers (COVID-19) Regulations, 2020, has authorised that cultural and traditional occasions shall maintain a maximum of 50 persons for occasions such as —

- (a) *Go isa mafoko;*
- (b) *Patlo;*
- (c) *Magadi; and*
- (d) *Kgoroso.*

and shall maintain a distance of 1 – 2 metres between each person.
