NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that His Excellency the President in accordance with regulation 30G of the Emergency Powers (COVID-19) Regulations, 2020, has authorised that societies may meet and at any one time the number of persons attending a meeting shall not exceed 50.

Every meeting shall have a host or convener. The host or convener of a meeting shall be responsible for the adherence to COVID-19 protocols for persons attending the meeting.

The following societies may meet as set out below —

- (a) faith based organizations;
- (b) any club, company, partnership or association registered by the Registrar of Societies; and
- (c) political parties, including central committees of political parties.

For the avoidance of doubt faith based organizations shall have a maximum of two religious services per week and shall not have more than 50 persons at any one service.
